If you haven't heard yet, Maddie had a big birthday last week. She hit the bit 2 – OH! I can't fathom how my spitfire 7 year old turned into a sweet (yet still spicy) 20 year old overnight. I've had a lot of people reach out and say how good she looks, moves, and acts for a 20 year old, and while there are many things that contribute to her maintaining her youth, I wanted to highlight a special product that I think has really helped her in many situations over the years. One of my trainers growing up suggested the Woof Wear Single Lock Brushing Boot to me and I've used them ever since, almost 10 years! Let's dive into what makes these boots my all-around favorite.

To start, I really appreciate the versatility of the Woof Wear Single Lock Brushing Boot. According to the Woof Wear website, they are composed of 5.5mm breathable neoprene, which not only helps Maddie's legs stay cool when we're training, but it also means they don't hold water. I've used these boots in many situations, including on cross country and on swimming excursions, and appreciate that if they get wet, they don't become heavy and waterlogged on Maddie's legs. They are secured snugly on Maddie's legs using multiple hook and loop closure straps. I have a pair of these boots for Maddie's front legs and back legs, and depending on the length of the boot the amount of straps increase and decrease. For example, since her knee to fetlock length is slightly shorter on her front legs, her front boots have three straps, while her hind boots have four straps. I appreciate having multiple straps because I'm able to give her the most adjusted and comfortable fit. I usually start with the middle straps and then do the top and bottom straps in order to ensure the Woof Wear Single Lock Brushing Boots are perfectly secured.

One of the most important highlights the Woof Wear Single Lock Brushing Boots sport is the protection they provide. While they are a relatively low profile boot, they provide a sturdy supportive padding against the interior of the boot. This padding is also reinforced with a sturdy, flexible plastic on the exterior of the boot. According to the woof wear website, the design of these boots helps provide protection against brushing, knocks and abrasions. Throughout the years as I've used these boots on Maddie, her legs have remained untouched and unharmed.

Lastly, the Woof Wear Single Lock Brushing Boots are machine washable! This is incredibly beneficial to me, as especially the hind boots, can get a little dirty after a few workouts. It is reassuring to know that they can be easily cleaned on the washing machine after a hard workout.

Overall, I appreciated the practicality and universal use of the Woof Wear Single Lock Brushing Boots. I value that they can be used in multiple situations and environments without losing their protective qualities. Lastly, I really enjoy that they are easy to maintain.
